I was first introduced to the 'Shap' approach when teaching in Leeds in the late 1960s/early 1970s. Owen Cole sent a letter round to Heads of RE/RS regarding a meeting concerned with setting up a group wanting to promote the Shap ethos. So I felt fully involved as, with Mary Hayward, I edited the Shap journal for a number of years, as well as editing the Longmans' edition of the Festivals book, and, with others, I helped edit an edition of the Handbook. So I felt fully involved in Shap for 20 or so years!
